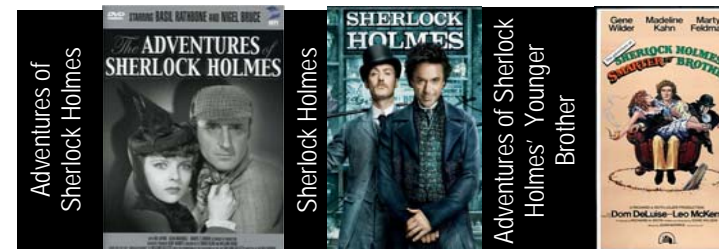


Preregistering for Programs

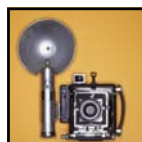
Community Read & Adult Summer Reading Programs

one is through life and the other through death.*

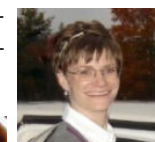

Papier-Mâché Greek Vases, July 12th and July 19th 2 PM. The ancient Greeks were master potters and used a vase painting style called "black figure technique"—we'll use this method to make papier-mâché vases. This is a two part workshop, as papier-mâché must dry before applying paint. All supplies are provided free of charge. Pre-registration is required.



Henna Tattoos Workshop, July 20th 1 PM. Mehndi, or henna tattoos, are skin designs traditionally used in India and Middle Eastern countries for ceremonial occasions. Henna tattoos are made with henna paste (natural henna, 100% essential oils, lemon juice, and sugar) and are completely natural and non-permanent. Genevieve Levin from ReMarkable Blackbird Studios, henna artist, is certified with the International Certification for Natural Henna Arts. All supplies are free of charge. Pre-registration is required.

14th Edition 5K Race & Concert - July 8th

Our 14th Edition 5K Run/Walk will be held on **Friday, July 8th at 6 PM!** This fun, family event features live music by the Mousam River Rats, food (free for registrants, low cost for all others) and back by popular demand, over 30 **spectacular** raffles, all proceeds benefiting the KFL. Tickets are on sale at the library through July 8th, 1 for \$1; 6 for \$5. New this year is a beer garden, so bring your dollars to buy raffle tickets and a beverage. Current ID must be presented to purchase beer.

The Run/Walk is a flat 5k course (3.1 miles, USATF registered and professionally timed) and winds its way through the heart of Kennebunk. A t-shirt and goodie bag will be given free to the first 200 registrants. Register early to secure your spot at the starting line; the race is limited to 500 participants. Online pre-registration is strongly encouraged —\$12 for adults, \$5 for those 14 and under (+ online fee), but mail-in registration is available (\$20 for adults, \$10 for those 14 and under) as well as on-site registration on race-day from 4-5:30 PM (\$25 for adults, \$10 for those 14 and under). Applications must be received by Tues., July 5th to be eligible for pre-registration prices.
